NORMAN ROGER YETMAN, Ph.D., 1969, University of Pennsylvania, is Professor of American Studies and Sociology at the University of Kansas, where he has been chairman of the American Studies Department. He is co-author of *Majority and Minority: the Dynamics of Racial and Ethnic Relations* (1971, 1975, 1982) and *Sociology: Experiencing a Changing Society* (1979, 1982), has edited a volume of selections from slave narratives (1970), and has published many articles. Professor Yetman was Visiting Fulbright Professor at the Universities of Odense and Copenhagen, 1981-82.
