HELGE NORMANN NILSEN, Dr. Philos, 1969, University of Bergen, has been dosent in American literature at the University of Trondheim since 1970. In addition to a wide range of articles on American literature and civilization, Dr. Nielsen has published *Hart Crane's Divided Vision: An Analysis of The Bridge* (1980) and is now completing a book on the novels of Saul Bellow. Present research projects include studies of Waldo Frank and Ludwig Lewisohn.

NIELS THORSEN has degrees from the University of Copenhagen and Princeton and now teaches American history and society in the English Department of University of Copenhagen. His earlier scholarship includes a study of Woodrow Wilson.

He is currently working on a fictional biography of Felix Carvajal, a Cuban mailman, who ran 680 miles to compete in the 1904 Olympic Marathon.
