Regarding references, please use either MLA or Chicago-style footnotes and include a bibliography at the end of your text. Submit your article proposal to editor Anders Bo Rasmussen at ras@sdu.dk and include a short CV. Your proposal will initially be assessed by our editorial team and a decision on the manuscript reached within a month. If your article is sent out for peer review, you can expect a double blind review process lasting approximately three months. Should your article be accepted, our editorial team will work with you throughout the last stages of the publication process. The final proofreading responsibility rests with the author.
